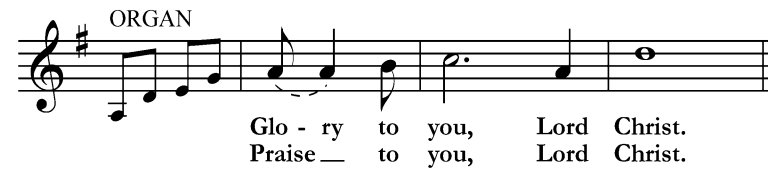

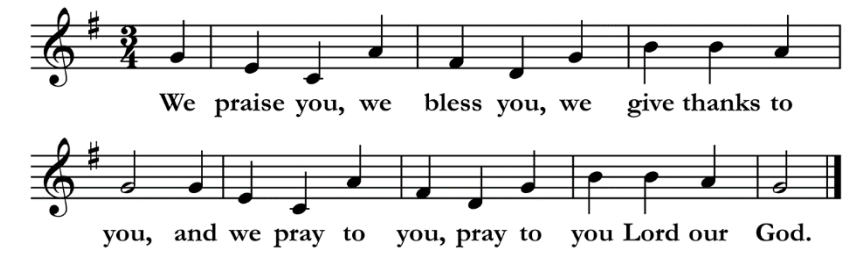

Easter: ...that we may stand...

During Lent, the penitential 40-day season before Easter, we do not say “Alleluia!” nor do we offer a blessing at the end of our services. During Easter, the celebratory 50-day season that runs through Pentecost, the “Alleluia!” returns, as does the closing blessing. In addition, during Easter, we take a break from the Confession of Sin, and we stand throughout the Eucharistic Prayer. Just as Christ has died to bear our sins and sorrows, so he rises that we may stand unashamed and joyous in God’s very presence. “The Lord is risen, indeed. Alleluia!”

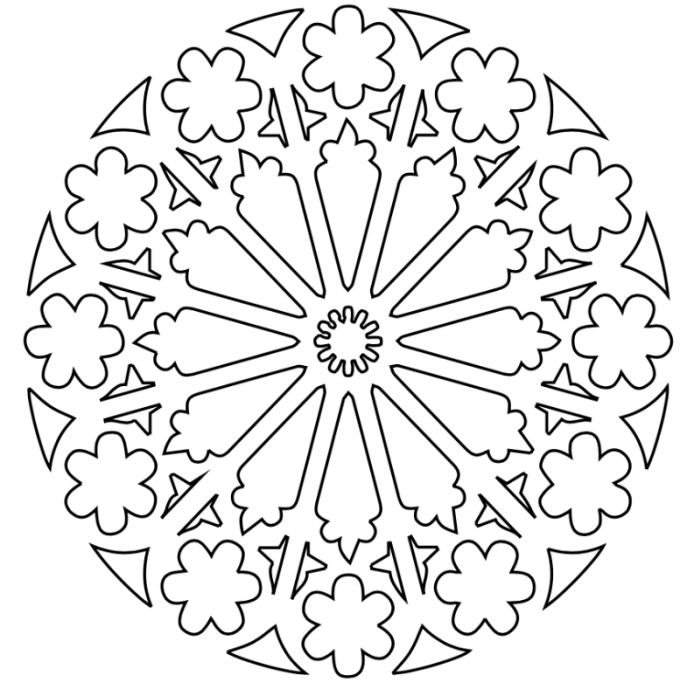
